SAFETY is the #1 priority of todays event. This is not a race, just a chance to challenge yourself and your skills at puzzle solving. You can look for all or some of these caches. They are all within Hanwell. You can find them in the order they are written or mix them up for your convenience. Some are connected with each other, so just have fun and discover some things that you may not have known about your community.

All caches have a safe place to pull over to park safely. DO NOT park of the side of the road as traffic passes by at 80 or above in this area. #3 cache is by the side of the road, but there is a good wide spot to pull off safely, but for a maximum of 1-2 cars at a time. So, if someone is there, just pick it up later.

Find the caches, sign the log and then log them on your app so you can get your smiley face. We have provided a tally sheet if you wish to track your progress.

Note: #9 is just a question which you can answer. The actual cache does not have a great place to park, so you can always log it sometimes when there is not much traffic around. And, #4 is a nano and the log paper is very hard to put back in place. You could always just log without signing the log paper.

Note: Home base is the front step of Hanwell Community Centre

- 1. There is a building on the corner of Hanwell Road and Deerwood Road. You would go there if interested in hearing a specific message. There is no cache here, BUT the 2 caches closest to this location are also sources of information. Log both caches.

 Hints: Building blocks are the keys.
- 2. There is a cache near a building on Hanwell Road that you often drive by but normally would have no reason to visit. And you would hope the people that work from there never have to visit your home. Log this cache and look at the insignia on the front of the building. Hint: Call 911 (DON'T really call)
- 3. There is a cache near Saint Mary's Cemetery on the Hanwell Road. After logging this cache, go to the building that used to be Saint Mary's Church. Answer this question: What is this building used for now?

 Hint: Drive to the stop sign on Mazerolle Settlement Road
- 4. There is a cache on Hanwell Road that is a Nano sized container, which means very tiny. The log is hard to roll back up. No need to open and sign. Just answer the questions on the tally sheet.

 Hint: "Be Prepared" is their motto.
- 5. Before leaving this location answer these questions: What is the name of the building near #4 cache? There is something that looks like a roadside book library but is used as....? Put answers on the tally sheet.
- 6. Now...go find the cache that is located near the Cemetery associated with the building in #5. Find the building that used to sit on this property but got moved to a new location. Answer these questions: How many times has this building been moved? What happened to this building that caused major damage within the last two years? Put answers on tally sheet
- 7. Find and log the cache that is closest to Home Base. No hint needed.
- 8. Directly behind Home Base are several connected trails. There are also several caches hidden. Log as many of these caches as you wish. Some areas may be wet so boots would be helpful.
- 9. There is a nearby cache called "CITO" What does this mean? Record answer on the tally sheet. Don't go there. No safe place to park.
