You and Your Dog in Hanwell Rural Community

It would be interesting to know just how many dogs live in Hanwell Rural Community. Given the known benefits of dog ownership, it is likely a big number. Dogs provide companionship and unconditional love no matter the age of their owner. They make their owner feel secure and less isolated. They can be part of their owner's social network, especially when they get their daily walk in public areas where they can visit with other humans and dogs alike.

Throughout Hanwell Rural Community, dogs are welcome in municipally owned parks and property, however, owners must respect the Community Dog Leash Policy (#2018-01) and the Provincial Dog Act. Here are the things to remember about these regulations:

1. Dogs being walked anywhere (including along streets and roads) in Hanwell Rural Community,

must be leashed unless it is in the off-leash section of the Hanwell Park Trail.

2. For the safety and security of everyone, dogs are not permitted to be at large, and must be in the control of their owner or care giver at all times.

Finally, did you know that when dog waste is left to break down on its own, it can get into our waterways through runoff? Fecal coliform bacteria can become a problem, as well as, algal blooms from all the extra nutrients from the dog poop. The ditch or stream water can become contaminated, with potential health

To get started, it's as easy as loading the free app on your phone, and creating an account with a username and password.
