Hanwell Resident Swims For Canada

Hanwell resident, Gillian Dicks, age 20, is very excited athletes with similar physical and intellectual to represent Canada through her journey of swimming! challenges. This levels the playing field.

Gillian joined the competitive Fredericton Aquanauts Swim Team (FAST) in September 2023, and in that same month, she joined the Canadian Down Syndrome Swimming Association (CDSSA). Gillian has also been swimming with the local Special Olympics Team for about 6 years. She swims four times a week, and the highlight of this exciting adventure is that she is a local para-swimmer who is competing with all three teams! Gillian and her family are very excited for many new competitive swimming opportunities.

The CDSSA team has 14 athletes across Canada. Their head coach is Darcy Irwin, from Nanaimo, BC, and their assistant coach is Roy Robinson, from St. John's, Newfoundland, and Labrador. They train locally (FAST for Gillian) with individual competitive teams and meet with Darcy and Roy virtually on a regular basis, to discuss their swimming program, exercise program, healthy living choices, etc. They meet in-person at the swim meets.

The CDSSA provides opportunities for national and international swimming competitions. The CDSSA is under the umbrella of the Down Syndrome International Swimming Organization (DSISO). Past Events under DSISO occurred in Nova Scotia (2018), Portugal (2022), and Turkey (2024). The teams are now awaiting announcements of the next international event with DSISO.

Being a part of the CDSSA and DSISO allows for opportunities to travel and compete nationally and internationally on a competitive level with other Gillian is excited for the training from her coaches and the opportunities to improve in her swimming, become stronger and faster, and compete within Canada and internationally. Recent events include competing with her CDSSA team in Montreal (March 2024), competing with her FAST team in Fredericton, St. Stephen, and PEI (Sept 2023-May 2024). The most recent event was Sunday, May 5th, in St. Stephen. The next Special Olympics swimming competition is Sunday, May 26th, at the Canada Games Aquatic Centre in Saint John.

Swimming races include a combination of four strokes: Butterfly, Breaststroke, Free Style, and Backstroke. Breaststroke and Free style are Gillian's favorites, at the distance of 100 m, which is 4-laps in a 25 m pool.

Gillian and her family would really like to thank her coaches with Special Olympics, FAST & CDSSA for coaching Gillian and helping her develop into a stronger, more competitive swimmer. They would also like to thank all the people, businesses, and organizations that have provided monetary donations to help support Gillian in her recent, past, and upcoming swimming competitions.

Council's Corner

Did you know that all regular and special meetings of council are recorded and placed on our website for review; if you missed it, this is what is happening in Hanwell.

By-Laws: By-Law #32-2024 Dangerous and Unsightly Premises - This by-law was amended to include the former Kingsclear LSD due to amalgamation as it was previously controlled by the province. Council is currently reviewing/amending the Procedural By-Law as well as the Tourism Accommodation Levy By-Law.

Any amendments to by-laws are posted twice per week for two weeks on our website www.hanwell.nb.ca under the Special Announcement section prior to the 3rd reading and enactment.

Hanwell EMO Plan: Adopted January 17, 2024 the public portion of the plan can be found on our website under the section Council/Administration. The Emergency Measures Organization Committee (EMO) is currently working on an Emergency Communication Policy as well as a Wildfire Evacuation Plan in conjunction with the province, stay tuned for further notifications.

UKFD/Community Hall: We received funding from the Canada Community Building Fund to upgrade the kitchen, all work is completed. The community hall located at 22 Mazerolle Settlement Road can be rented for functions; to do so contact Megan at 506-460-1177, ext, 1 or administration@Hanwell.nb.ca.

<u>Staffing:</u> We are pleased to welcome our summer students again this year and we have filled the vacant position of Assistant Clerk. Our students can be easily recognized with Hanwell Staff shirts (will have in June).

BMX Bike Trail: A new BMX trail is being constructed at the park on Camber Drive. This is not intended for motorized bikes. The park is to be completed by the beginning of June, until then this area is closed. Stay tuned for a Grand Opening announcement. We would like to thank Trail Flow for their design and construction. Please note that the park hours are dawn to dusk as per By-Law #24-2022.

<u>Strategic Plan:</u> Council will be working with a consultant to develop a 5-year strategic plan. This will involve public consultations and surveys, so kindly get involved.

<u>Access Road:</u> We will be starting a new access road to the left of the Hanwell Park so that we can access our trails without taking vehicles over the accessibility trail. This area will be fenced off during construction however please take caution to heavy machinery.



Community Reminder: Solid Waste Collection and Disposal Information:

As written in By-Law No. 07-2015, and amended February 23rd, 2021, garbage will only be picked up if it is bagged. Bags must be securely tied to avoid garbage becoming loose. The garbage trucks do not have the lifters necessary to collect loose garbage.

For the collection and disposal of larger items exceeding 44 lbs., residents must contact.

BMI (506-209-0669) prior to placing these items at the side of the road. Residents are permitted to one collection of larger items per month, and a total of 9 collections per year.

Garbage is collected between the hours of 7:00 am and 7:00 pm. Residents must have garbage at the side of the road by 7:00 am.













