

FireSmart New Brunswick: Strengthening Community Resilience Against Wildfires

As wildfires become an increasingly prevalent threat in New Brunswick, the provincial government has launched the FireSmart NB program to help communities proactively reduce wildfire risks and enhance resilience. This initiative is part of a broader national effort, supported by both provincial and federal governments, to mitigate the impacts of wildfires in a changing climate.

FireSmart NB is New Brunswick's adaptation of FireSmart Canada, a national program established in 1993 to help communities reduce wildfire risks through science-based strategies and community engagement. The provincial program tailors these strategies to local needs, providing resources and guidance to equip New Brunswickers with the tools to protect their homes, businesses, and communities from wildfires.

FireSmart NB empowers communities to take proactive steps in reducing wildfire risks through education, training, and collective action. By implementing FireSmart principles, New Brunswickers can protect their homes and neighborhoods, contributing to a safer and more resilient province in the face of increasing wildfire threats.

Council's Corner January-April 2025

Garbage Collection- Leaves and Garden Refuse

- "By-Law 07-2015 "A By-Law to Regulate the Collection and Disposal of Solid Waste", which was adopted on April 8, 2015, has always stated that leaves are considered street rubbish and were not to be picked up by the contractor. However, we had an agreement with the contractor, as a courtesy to our residents, to pick up a few bags of leaves until it became excessive. Within the last six months, many residents were leaving out upwards of 70 bags of leaves.
- Council has advised BMI that we will no longer be picking up leaves, it will be up to the residents to dispose of them.
- "Garden Refuse and Waste" defined as waste matter from gardens, consisting of dead branches, bushes, weeds, plants and similar materials" will be collected but **must** be clearly identified as garden refuse.
- Council will be looking into other options, such as compostable bins, for the future, stay tuned.

Yoho Park

- An area of approximately 2445.5 sq meters has been cleared.
- Playground equipment, parking lot and pavilion/gazebo will be constructed this summer.
- Funds for this project will be under the Canada Community Building Fund (formerly known as the Gas Tax Fund).

Merge Program through Planet Hatch/Ignite

- Hanwell has been approved to do two projects through this program. Both programs will be done jointly with other municipalities; however, our plans will be done based on the municipality's individual needs.
- Land Identification (with Central York) The company will create a tool with layered maps combining maps obtained from various platforms and government departments to ensure all our enquiries are in one place.
- **Identifying Water Sources** (with Arcadia) The company will create a tool showing our water sources which will assist with future development and to ensure that we have the water resources to sustain future growth.

Traffic Concerns on Hanwell Road

- Meetings have been held with MLA Cindy Miles to discuss traffic concerns.
- A survey was given to business owners asking for the number of vehicles they would have on a daily basis, including staff vehicles. We also wanted to know what they felt were issues so that we would have some evidence to support our concerns when we address the province. As of April 1st, 2025, 35 businesses responded, stating that they have approximately 1508 vehicles daily (times 2 for the return). This is clearly a safety issue and needs to be addressed sooner than later.
- MLA Cindy Miles has met with council, and a meeting with the Ministers of Public Safety and the Minister of Transportation along with invited business owners and media is being organized.

Property Purchased

- Property adjacent to Camber Drive and facing Hanwell Road (17.7 acres) has been purchased for future development.

Audited Financial Statements

- Our auditor, Jill Stairs KMPG LLP, presented the audited financial statement in March.
- For the 2024 budget (\$4,258,675) there was a deficit of \$1074.00.

Dog Leash Policy

- A new policy was adopted.
- All dogs must be kept on a leash and under full control in public spaces and on municipal property.


2025 Maxi Saber Pumper/Tanker Truck





